NSW Gazette – Updated List of Declared Articles

NSW Government Gazette No. 31 issued on 10 March 2017 incorporates two new Declaring Definitions as follows:-

- Building Wiring Cable; and
- Double Capped Light Emitting Semiconductor Lamp.

The requirement for Building wiring cable is substantially aligned with AS/NZS 4417.2, however the application date is postponed until 29 January 2018.

The requirement for Double Capped Light Emitting Semiconductor Lamp takes effect immediately, and NSW Fair Trading will commence enforcement action from 10 March 2017.



Amendment 3 to AS/NZS 3112 is now included in the class specification for PLUG and SOCKET OUTLETS.

At this time AIR CONDITIONING APPLIANCE is not added to the NSW declared articles list. Product offered for sale in Queensland and Victoria will continue to require electrical safety certification for these articles.

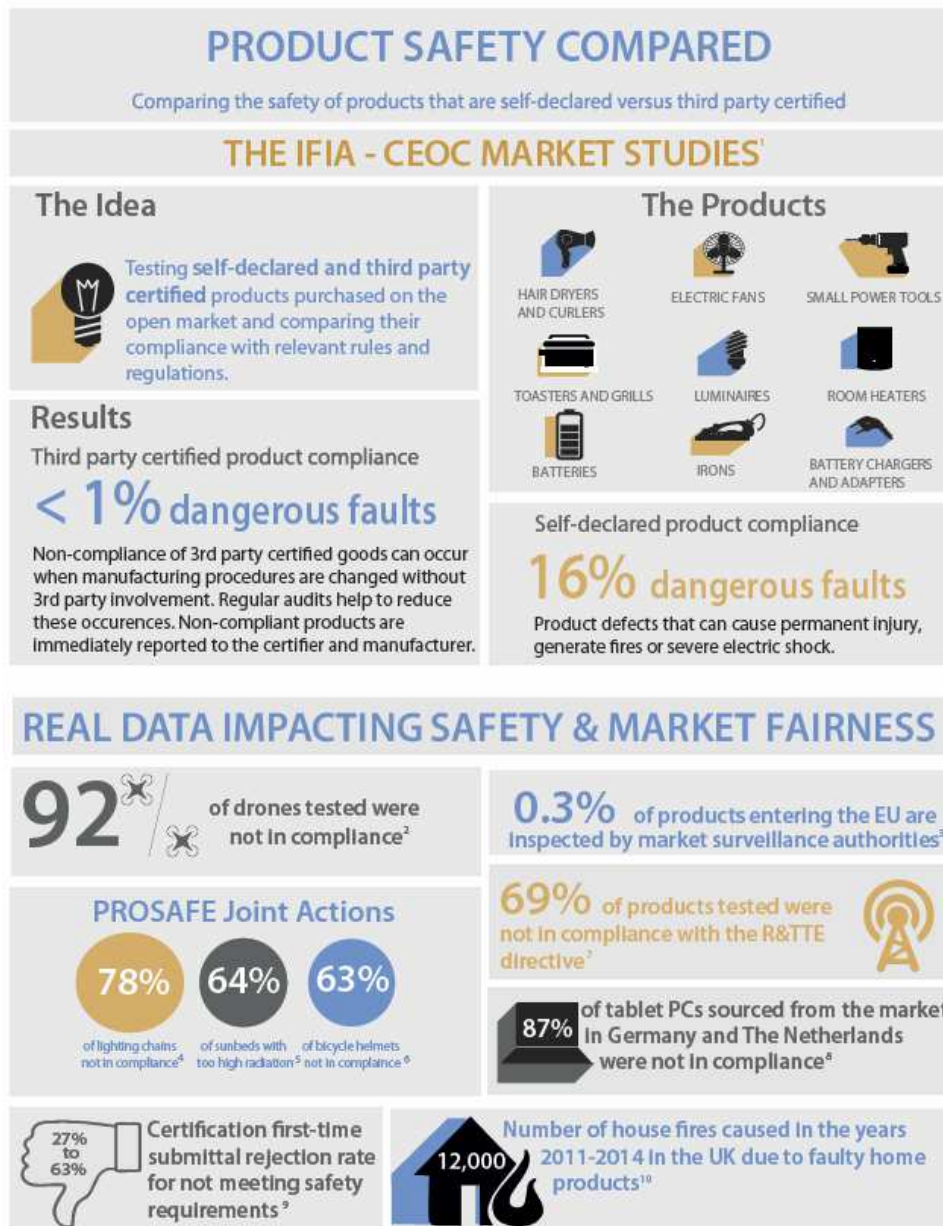
